Introduction

Newick's Playing Fields are located on Allington Road, Newick. They consist of the King George V Playing Fields (KGVPF) and the adjoining Manwaring Robertson Field. KGVPF is a designated Fields in Trust field. Both KGVPF and the Manwaring Robertson Field are owned by Newick Parish Council. Both have several rights of way and are well used by walkers as they give access to nearby areas of open countryside.

On the KGVPG site there is a Sports Pavilion, an area with play equipment, outdoor gym equipment (made available to use from May 2023), a cricket/stoolball pitch, a football pitch, a MUGA (multi use basketball/goal), batting cages and several benches.

The Marwaring Robertson field in Newick is home to a rugby pitch, three benches and a set of skate ramps. These ramps had been onsite for over 25 years and had come to the end of their useful life. In 2022 plans were drawn up for a new skate park, planning permission applied for, and these were approved by Lewes District Council.

Methodology

Newick Parish Council agreed to conduct a sound survey at Marwaring Robertson. It was agreed to conduct the survey over a period of five weeks. The survey started 31st July 2023, ending 3rd September 2023. Readings were taken daily in decibels using a sound level meter at the same location (the Wayne Thomas Memorial Bench), for five minutes each time, by four Councillors (on a rota basis) and at different times of the day. Councillors were asked to record the highest/lowest recording, note the source of noise and any important/relevant information e.g., weather conditions. Newick Parish Council acknowledge that the survey was conducted during the school holidays, and therefore use of the Playing Fields likely to be elevated compared to other times of year. The Parish Council also acknowledge that the novelty of new Outdoor Gym equipment and new Skate Park will result in more users initially.

08.08.23	16.20 to 16.25	66.2	33.9	Windy with drizzle. 1 Mum and 2 young children at the skate park. 4 youngsters playing by the basketball hoop, 2 in the cricket nets and 4 using the outdoor gym equipment. 1 cyclist and 1 dog walker with dog on lead.
09.08.23	16.52 to 16.57	73.6	44.1	Warm afternoon with a very gentle westerly. 8 lads (young teenagers) 7 with scooters and 1 on a bike were at the skate park. 2 lads in the nets, 1 chap doing white lining, 1 youngster on his own in the playground and 6 young teenage girls sat on the south side of the KGVPF chatting, some sat on one of the seats and the rest on the grass in front of them.

At the skate park there were 4 lads but one left after a couple of minutes, all were active and having fun using scooters, occasional shouts of glee and 2 helicopters went over.
11.08.23	12.38 to 12.43	72.1	35.5	Overcast, dry and a gentle westerly. 5 at the skate park with 1 adult, a mix of scooters and bikes. 2 kids 1 adult in playground, 2 kids 1 adult in nets. 2 adult walkers and 1 adult with child and dog on lead.
12.08.23	14.56 to 15.01	79.2	53.1	Very strong and gusty south westerly wind. Cricket match being played with some spectators outside and the batting team watching from the bar. One dog walker, 3 children in the playground and 3 on bikes at the skate park. There was a plane going over and church bells being played during the monitoring, but the high readings were during the gusts which caused very loud tree noise.
13.08.23	17.41 to 17.46	55.4	37.3	Sunny 19 degrees and an occasional gusty south south-westerly. Nobody at the skate park. One runner, 2 adult dog walkers and 1 adult with 1 child in the playground. Tree noise from gusts were the higher readings.

Weather sunny and calm. Highest reading of 71.1 recorded when young girl playing in playing field screamed.
16.08.23	1650 to 1655	73.5	36.9	Sunny and calm. 6 youths in playground. 6 youngsters on scooters on skateramp. Family on gym equipment. Highest reading of 73.5 when 1 youngster shouted when he fell off his scooter.

23.08.2023	16:13- 16:18	68.7	35.4	Weather was very sunny and hot. On the field there were 3 people using the cricket nets and one person walking a dog. On the skatepark there were 6 boys, 3 with scooters and 3 with bikes.

30.08.2023	17:48- 17:53	56.6	38.2	Warm but overcast with sunny spells. 4 using the skatepark (scooters). 2 using the cricket nets but no one at the gym or play area. 1 family of 4 with a dog.

Summary

Week one's highest reading was 83.3 due to wind (no skate park users), the lowest reading for that week 35.4 (two skate park users). The average high reading for this week was 64. The average low reading for this week was 41.4.

Week two's highest reading was 79.2 due to wind, the lowest reading for week 2 was 33.9 (two children one adult using skate park). The average high reading for this week was 69.41. The average low reading for this week was 40.27.

Week three's highest reading was 73.5 (from a skate park user shouting), the lowest reading for that week 32.5 (one skate park user). The average high reading for this week was 70.05, the average low reading for this week 37.91.

Week four's highest reading was 69.3 (five skatepark users), the lowest reading for that week 31.3 (no skatepark users). The average high reading for this week was 53.27. The average low reading for this week is 35.61.

Week five's highest reading was 84.3 due to family fun day at Rugby Field. The lowest reading 34.2 (six skatepark users). The average high reading for this week was 60.08. The average low reading for this week is 39.27.

The average reading across highs and lows for the five weeks is 51.12.

Conclusions

Councillors were pleased with the conduct of users of the Playing Fields overall. The highest readings were from wind and the family fun day at Rugby Pitch. Councillors noted that the surface of the skatepark itself is very quiet when in use. Newick Parish Council concludes that that there is not a need for acoustic fencing next to the skate park. In the September 2023 meeting of the Parish Council, it was decided to have some plants along the fence line behind the skate park with the aim that as these grow and mature, they will provide more privacy for neighbouring properties and absorb some noise. This report has been shared with the Environmental Health Team at Lewes District Council.
